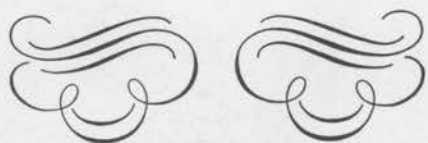

No quality of Christian character can be essential that is not possible to every man. Madison College is endeavoring to develop within you, dear student, a Christian character that will enable you to attain Heaven.

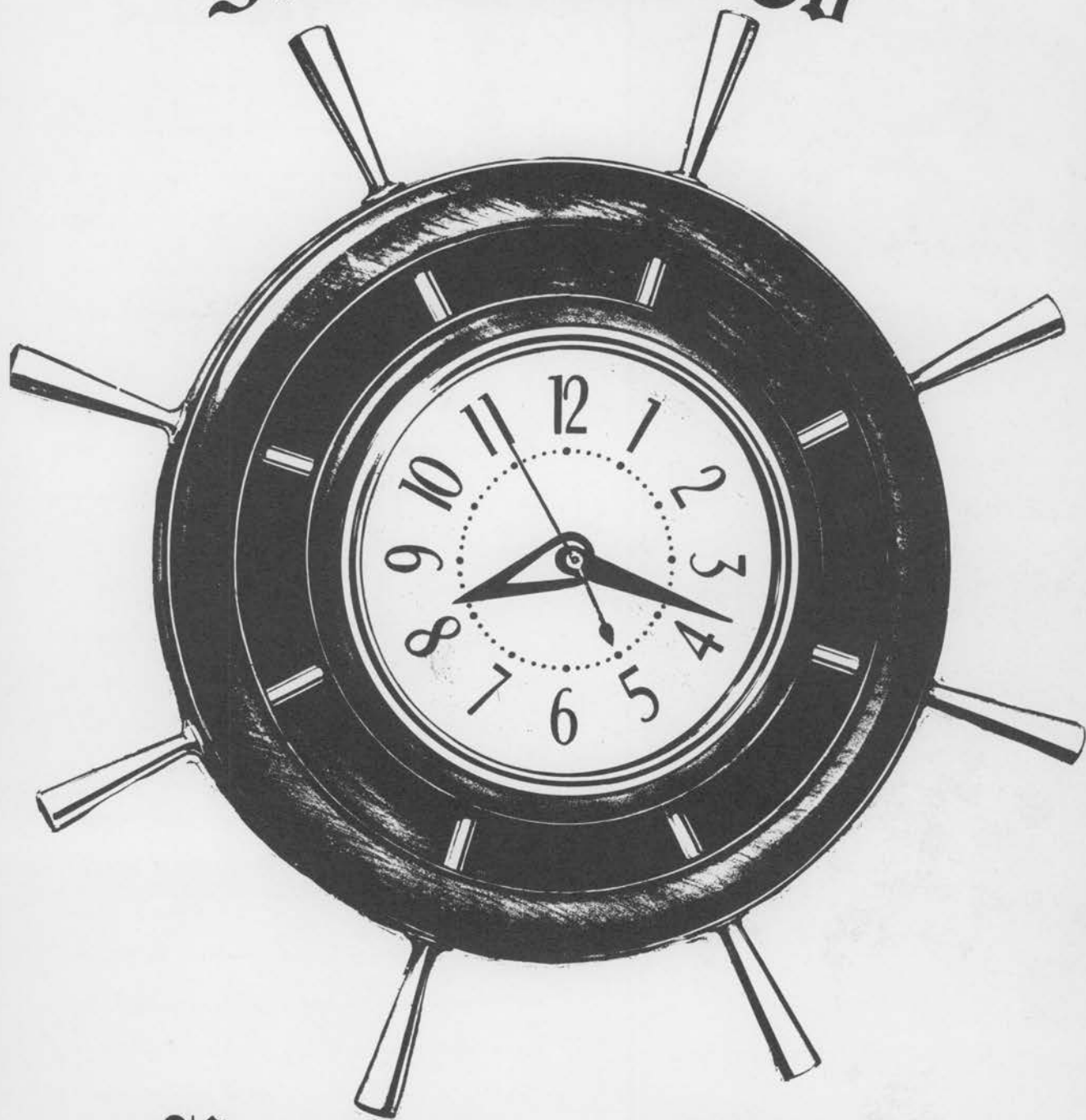
The staff of Madison College has dedicated themselves to co-operate with the divine purpose in imparting a knowledge of God, and the molding of the character into harmony with the Divine.
