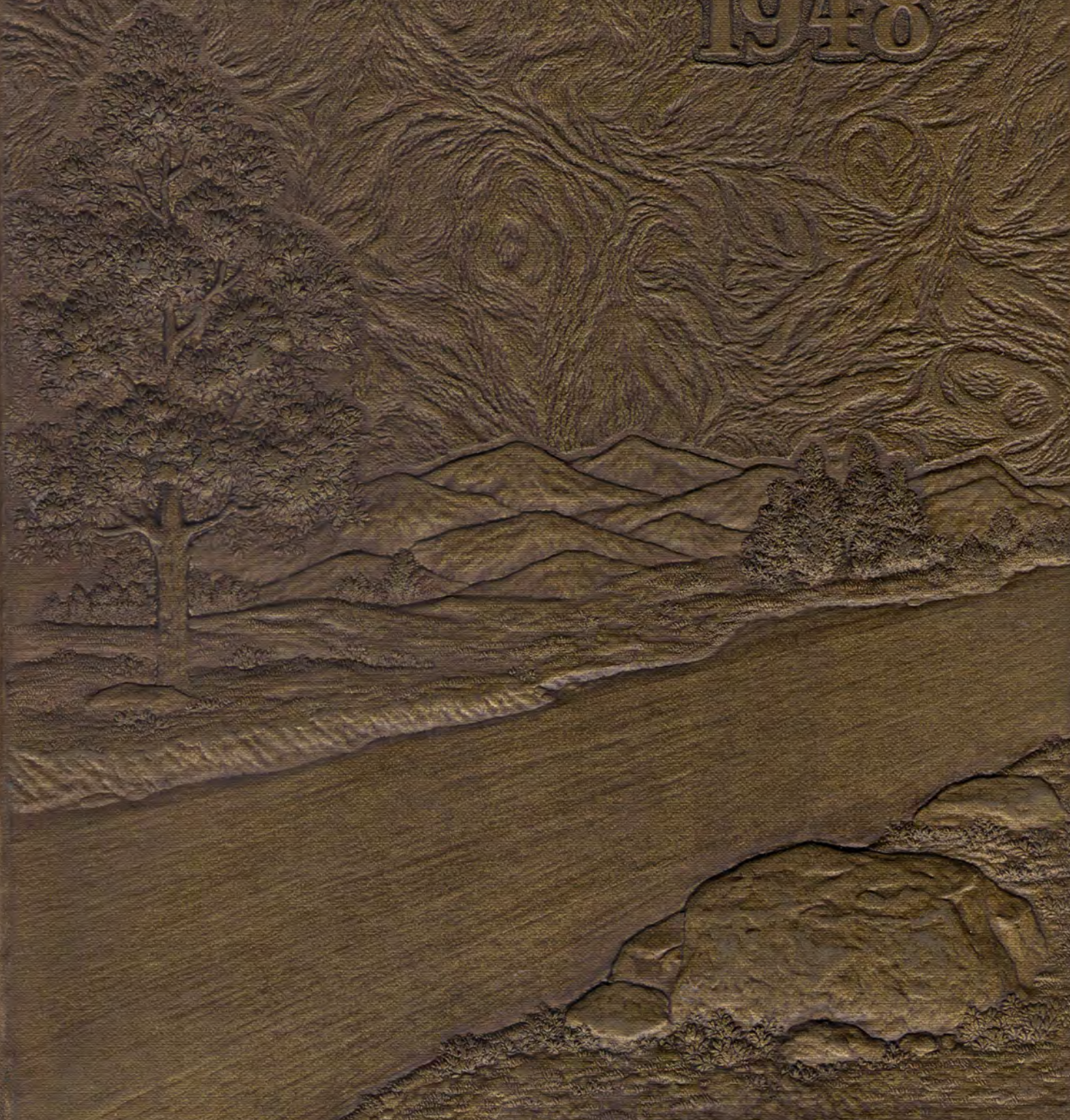

INTRODUCTION

Erected on a site chosen by Mrs. E. G. White, Madison College has remained distinctly different — its primary objective has been to instill in the heart of each student the desire to become a Christian worker. Herbert Spencer, an English philosopher of the last century, made this observation: "The great aim of education is not knowledge, but action." It is through the great fundamental principles of true education, development of physical, mental, and moral powers, that Madison students are prepared for action.

Throughout its history Madison College has advocated a directed work-study program. Country living and self-maintenance from the soil and other basic activities are stressed. By classroom instruction and demonstration in its industrial departments, Madison seeks to prepare men and women to meet the everyday problems of the Christian farmer, nurse, teacher, or homemaker.

Nestled in one of the picturesque bends of the Cumberland River, the seven-hundred-acre school-farm provides the peaceful serenity of rural life. Its forty-acre campus abounds with birds and squirrels, and more than a thousand varieties of plants from various sections of the world make it a place of excellent beauty.

The organization of Madison College and Sanitarium is unique in that its constituency is made up of both workers of the institution and also a limited number of others who are definitely interested in its self-supporting objectives. Officers of the General, the Southern Union, and the local conference of Seventh-day Adventists are members of the constituency, as are also representatives of the Southern Publishing Association and Southern Missionary College. The majority of the members of the constituency, however, are teachers and other workers permanently connected with the college itself.

The constituency of the institution elects annually the members of the board of directors. This board deals with the general policies of the institution and elects the administrative officers. Another interesting and unique feature of the institution is that the college, food factory, and the sanitarium all operate as a unit. The officers of each of these divisions, together with other members of the board who are residents of the campus, make up the executive committee which directs the policies of the institution between meetings of the board of directors. The president of the college and the general manager are executive officers having general direction of the entire institution.

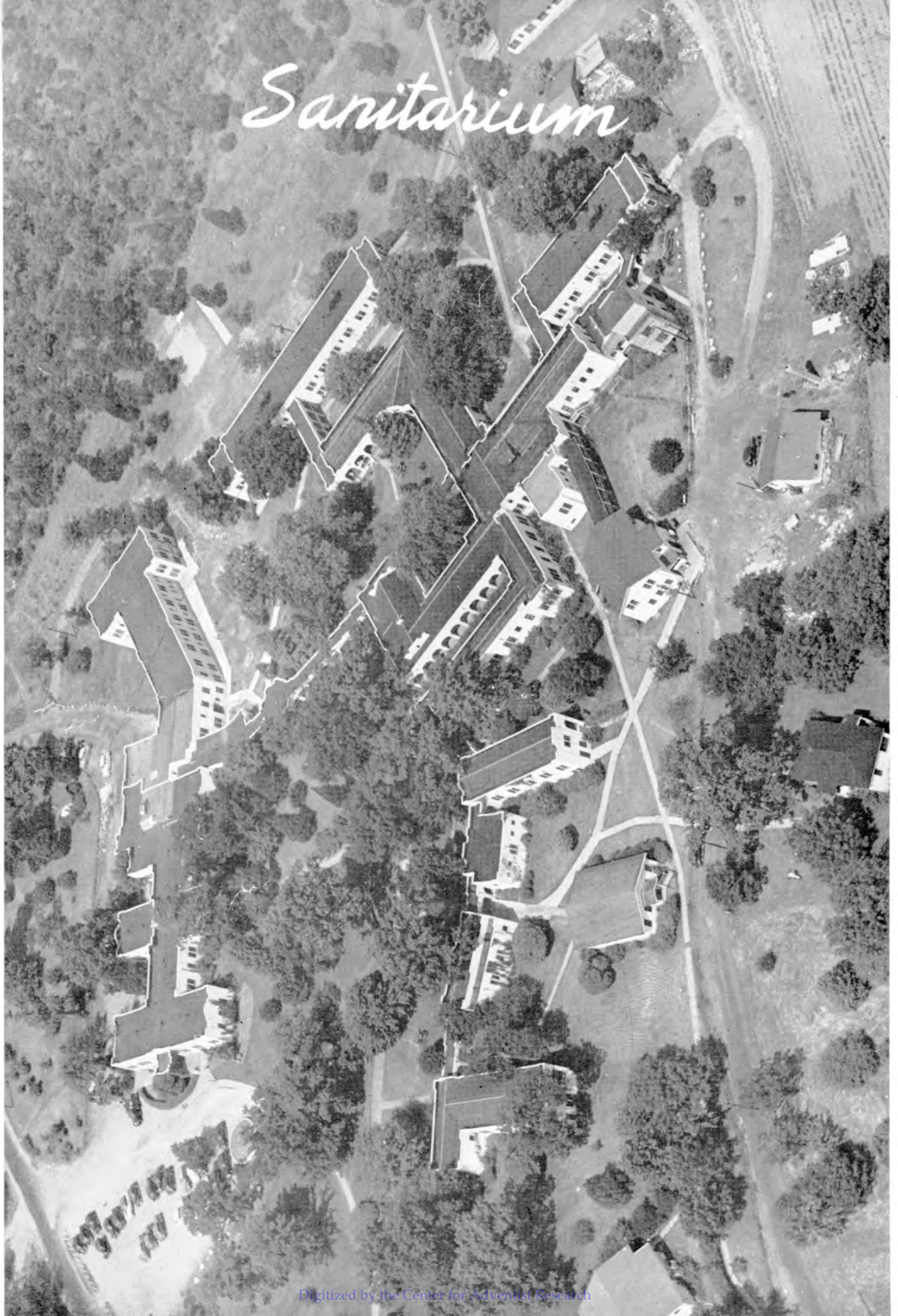

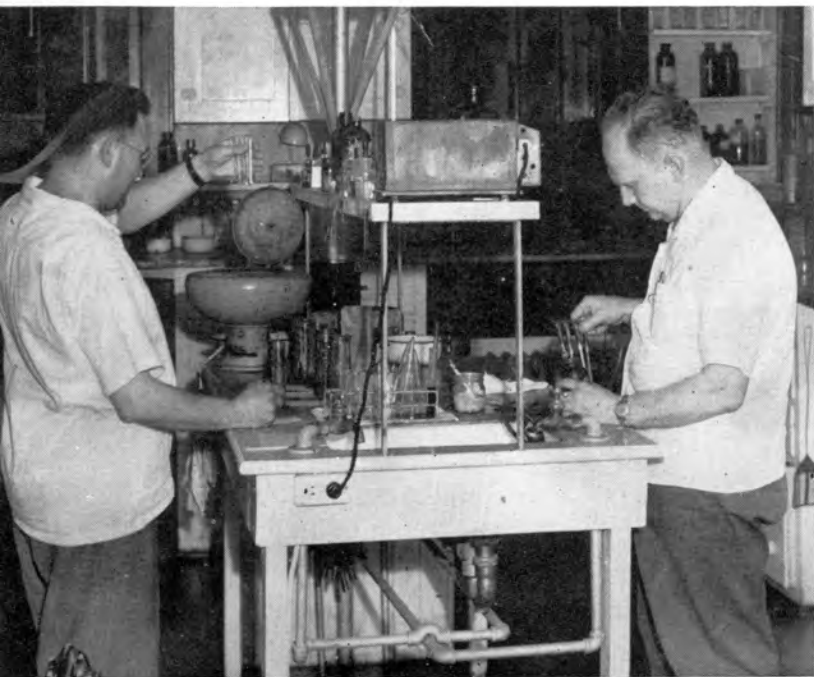

Madison is fortunate in having a modern, 165-bed sanitarium and hospital correlating its activities with that of the college. Over 3,000 patients were admitted during 1947, and statistics show a substantial increase for the first part of 1948. The sanitarium provides every facility for training nurses, dietitians, and laboratory and X-ray technicians.

Not only are the patient's physical needs cared for, but his spiritual needs as well. Patients are invited to attend Sabbath services and prayer meeting as well as worship every evening in the sanitarium parlor. Timely books, magazines, and pamphlets are provided on convenient racks where they are readily accessible to all patients.

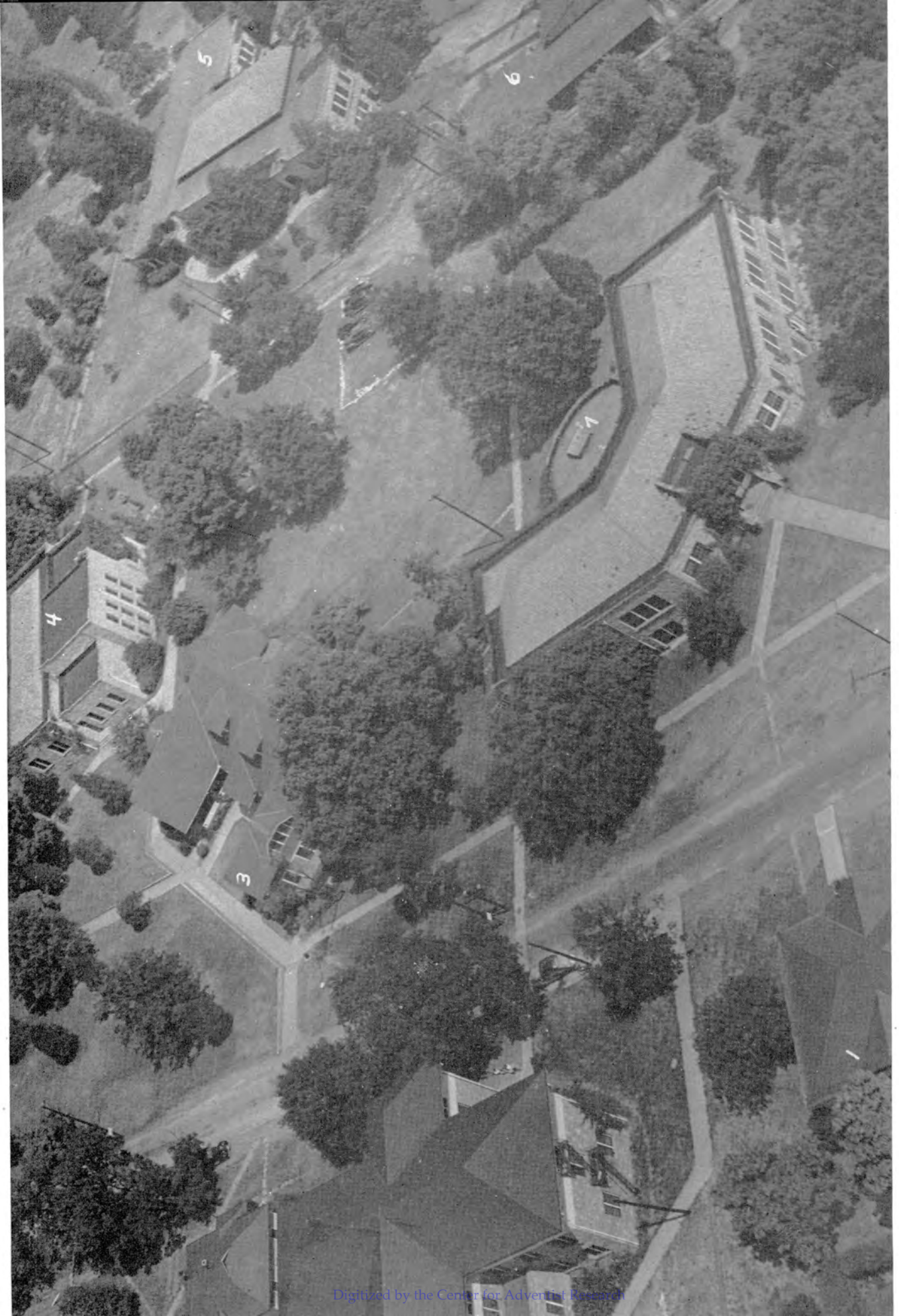
