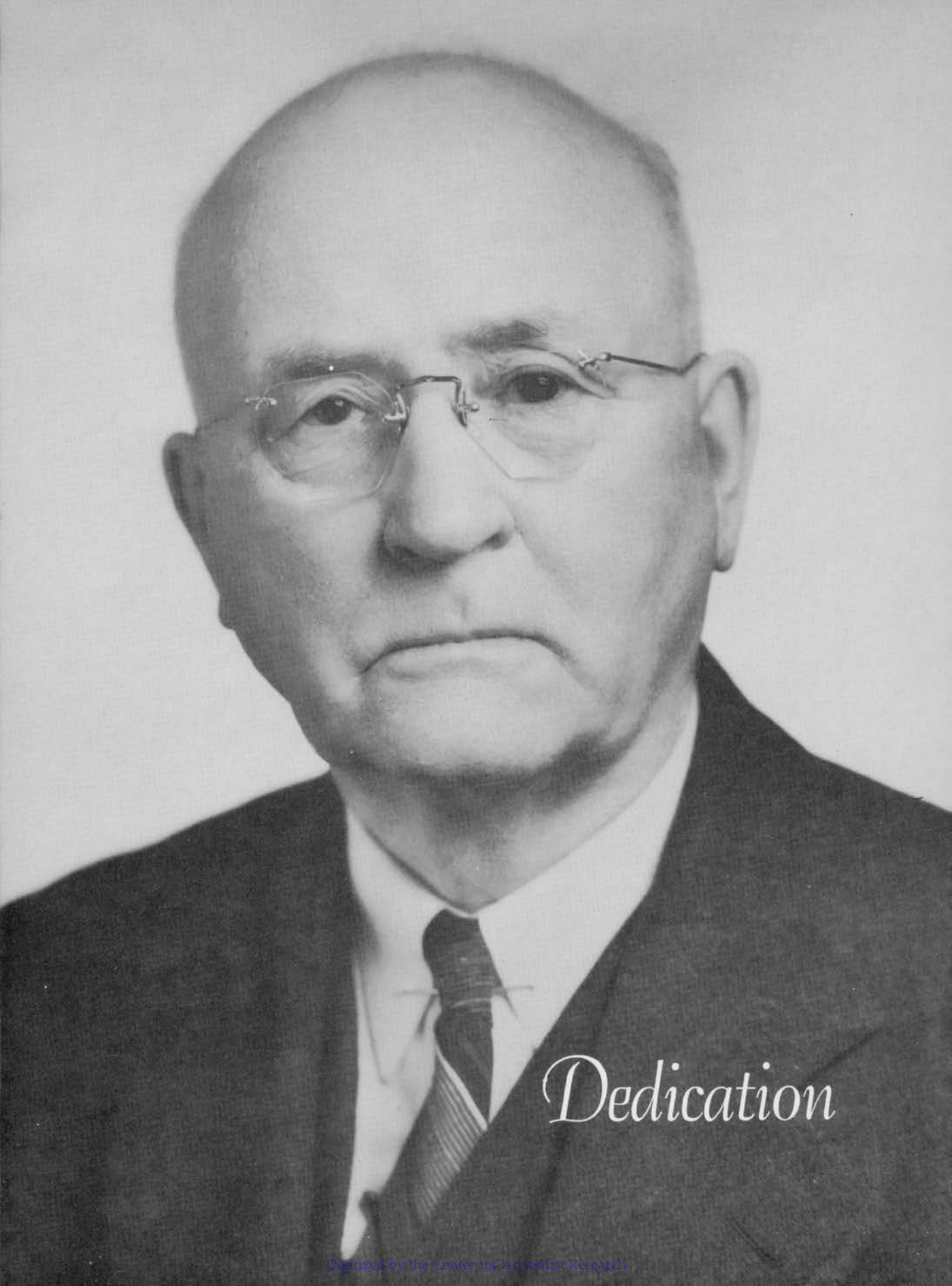

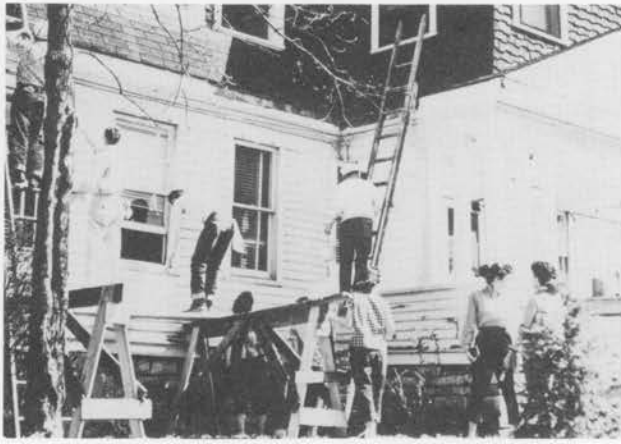


Dedication

In the year 1904, Edward A. Sutherland resigned as president of Emmanuel Missionary College and came south to answer the call of the servant of the Lord. Under the guidance of Mrs. White, Dr. Sutherland led out in founding Madison College and Sanitarium. Under his leadership it has grown from an old run down farm with a few slave cabins on it to the institution as one sees it today.
