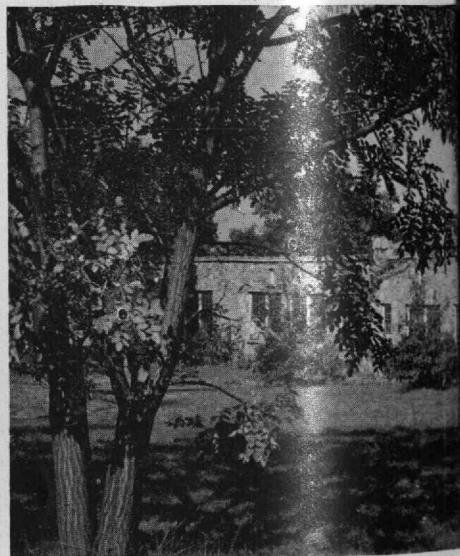


Cumberland River

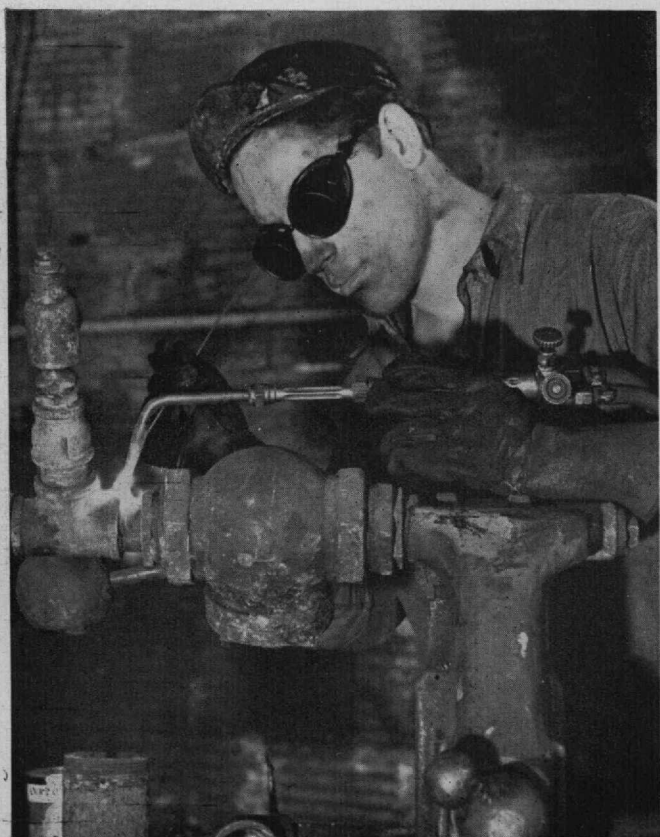


Campus View from Hospital Corridor

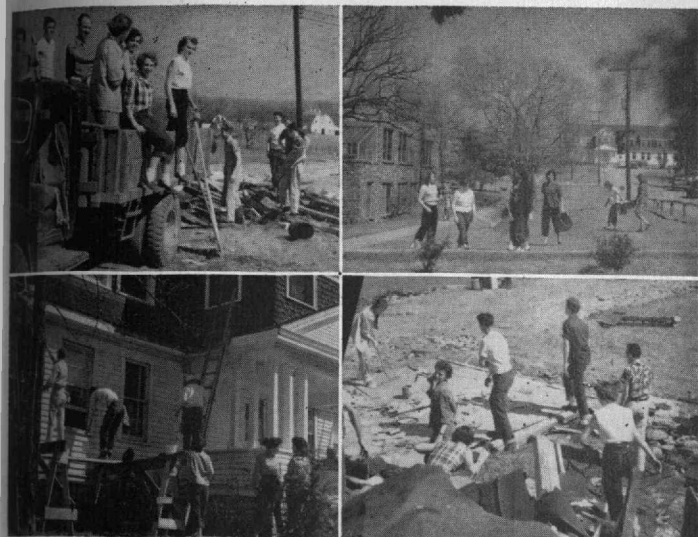

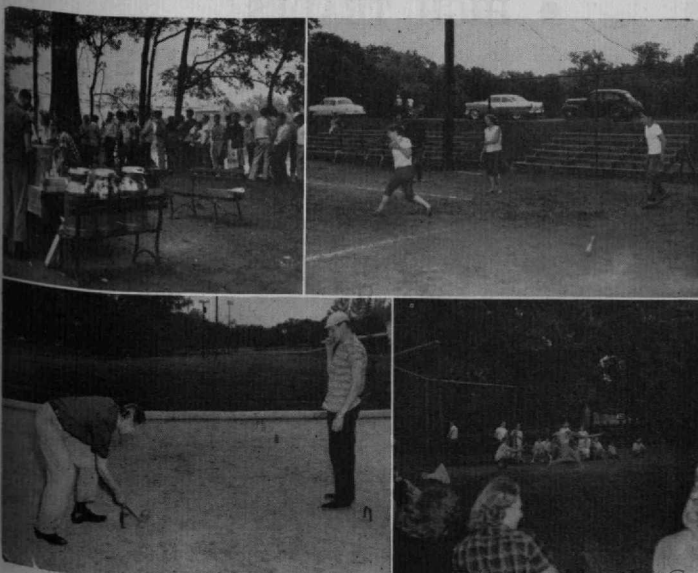




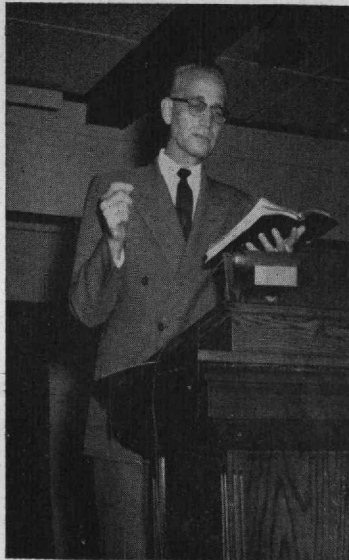
