Graduating Nurses Receive Pins

Eight graduating nurses received their pins in an impressive pinning ceremony held in the Assembly Hall on Thursday evening, August 17.

During the processional played by Mr. Walper, undergraduate nurses led the procession of graduating nurses, who took their places on the platform in front of the nurses who were to pin them.

Seventy-five degrees, diplomas, and certificates were presented to those completing seven courses of study at the annual commencement of Madison College, held on Saturday night, August 19. The Friday and Sabbath morning services were held in Helen Funk Assembly Hall, and the Saturday night graduation on the lawn.

B.S. degrees were presented to 25, Nursing diplomas to 27, X-ray certificates to 2, Medical Technology certificates to 3, Anesthesiology certificates to 7, Medical Record Technology certificates to 6, and Physical Therapy Technique certificates to 5.

Graduation weekend began on Friday night with the consecration service. This was followed by the baccalaureate sermon on Sabbath morning. The climax of the weekend came on Saturday night with the commencement address and the awarding of degrees, diplomas, and certificates.



Eugene Robert Post

The entire Madison College community was saddened at the death of an esteemed fellow student, Eugene Post, who died on August 17, 1961, after a long illness in the Madison Sanitarium-Hospital.

Eugene, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leland Carpenter Post, was born October 30, 1929, at San Antonio, Texas. His early years were spent with his parents in many places, as his father's military career took him to various parts of the world.

During World War II the father gave his life for his country while in the Philippines.

Most of Eugene's formal education was completed in Riverside, California. From his earliest years he was serious minded, and during his early teens he became an active member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, to which he dedicated all of his energy and was loyal and faithful to the end.

At the close of his army service in 1954 he came to Madison as a student in the School of X-ray Technology, which course he completed in 1960. For a time he was associated with the Schuler Clinic in Ellijay, Georgia, but in 1958 he returned to the Madison College campus to continue his technical education. He was working at the hospital at the time he was stricken.

He was married to Miss Ruby Sykes, a former student and a church school teacher, on October 11, 1959. Together they dedicated their lives to the Lord to be used in His work. Besides his wife, Ruby, he leaves a baby son.

As a student of Madison College he was highly respected as a devout Christian. His life witnessed to the sincerity of his profession, and his faith in the providences of God was strong to the end.

Two floodlights, partially hidden in shrubs, illuminate the sign at night and let visitors know that they are facing the Madison College campus.
