Christie Chui-Shan Chow, PhD. A native of Hong Kong, Christie Chui-Shan Chow is a visiting scholar at Princeton Theological Seminary where she earned her doctoral degree in religion and society. Her monograph, entitled *Schism: Seventh-Day Adventism in Post-Denominational China* (University of Notre Dame Press, 2021), is the first work that investigates the denomination in contemporary China. Her work appears in the *Journal of the Royal Asiatic Society*, *Journal of World Christianity*, *Social Sciences and Missions*, *Frontiers of History in China*, and *Exchange*.



Kevin M. Burton, PhD cand., is the Director of the Center for Adventist Research, an Assistant Director of the Ellen G. White Estate, and an Assistant Professor in the Church History Department at the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary at Andrews University. He concentrates his research on Millerite and Seventh-day Adventist history, with particular interest in the topics of race and gender, apocalypticism, and politics and the state. His M.A. thesis is titled, "Centralized for Protection: George I. Butler and His Philosophy of One-Person Leadership" and some of his recent publications include, "Cracking the Whip to Make a Perfect Church: The Purge of the Battle Creek on April 6, 1870" and "John Wesley Kelchner, Founder of the Temple Restoration Movement: A Freemason's Attempt to Build a World Chain of Solomon's Temples for Global Peace." His Ph.D. dissertation explores Adventist political involvement in the abolition movement.

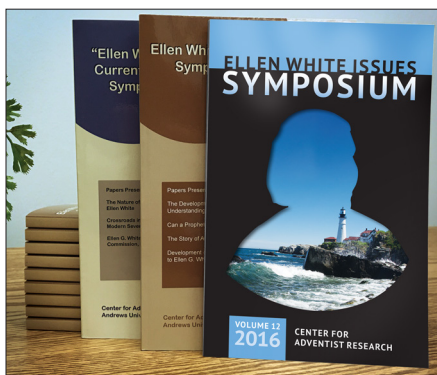

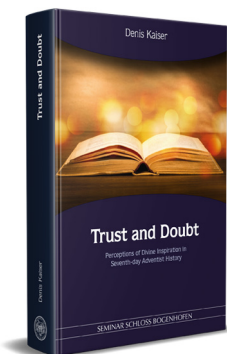
