Ingram R. London, PhD cand., is an Assistant Professor of Systematic Theology and Ethics at Oakwood University, School of Theology in Huntsville, AL. Before his doctoral studies, he served as a lay pastor in Indiana and Texas. His research interest lies at the intersection of Race, Theodicy, and Adventist Studies. His dissertation topic addresses the plausibility of developing a Black Theodicy within a Cosmic-Conflict worldview.



Tim Poirier, MTS, is the Vice-Director and Archivist of the Ellen G. White Estate at the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists, where he has served since 1981. In addition to articles and contributions in the *Ellen G. White Encyclopedia* and other church publications, he is the General Editor of the *Ellen G. White Letters and Manuscripts with Annotations* series.



James Mutua, PhD, is the director of the Ellen G. White Research Centre and a lecturer in the department of Theology and Religious Studies at the University of Eastern Africa, Baraton, Kenya. After completing a BA in theology at that institution, he earned an MDiv and a PhD in Old Testament from Andrews University. He is currently completing the Ellen G. White and Adventist Studies Graduate Certificate.

Gerson C. Rodrigues, PhD, is a professor and director of the Ellen G. White Research Center in Northeast Brazil College. His dissertation is entitled, "The Best Man That Ever Trod Shoe Leather' and His 'Crown of Rejoicing': The Personal Relationship of James and Ellen White, 1845-1881." He is the author of a book published in Portuguese, O "Melhor Homem" e Sua "Coroa de Alegria": O Casamento de Tiago e Ellen White (2023) [The "Best Man" and His "Crown of Rejoicing": The Marriage of James and Ellen White].




