History

In brief, Seventh-day Adventist higher education began in 1874 when Battle Creek College opened its doors in Battle Creek, Michigan. After over 25 years of troubled existence, the college leadership, with the encouragement of Ellen G. White, moved thewhole school, in the summer of 1901, to rural Berrien Springs, Michigan.

The school in a new location adopted the name Emmanuel Missionary College. It grew slowly over the next 56 years. In 1958, the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists voted to move the graduate school and theological seminary it controlled from Washington, D.C. to the campus of Emmaneul Missionary College. Over the next two years the Berrien Springs campus evolved to become Andrews University.

In the early 1930s, the Seventh-day Adventist Church began to recognize the need for a more professional ministry as well as a better educated teaching corp. The General Conference launched the Advanced Bible School in the early part of the decade. It's goal was to teach ministers how to be better ministers. Beginning at Pacific Union College and later moving to Takoma Park, Maryland, it found a permanent home as part of the General Conference properties in Washington, D.C. Through the years the name changed to the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary. In the 1950s a graduate program was added.

By the late 1950s, space was becoming an issue at what was then known as Potomac University. At the 1958 Annual Council of the Church, Emmanuel Missionary College President, Floyd Rittenhouse, invited Potomac University to relocate to the College campus in Berrien Springs, Michigan. It was voted to accept this invitation.

Scope

This collection contains only minutes of meetings from the various entities. The minutes date back to very near the beginning of Battle Creek College, established in 1874. Minutes from the founding years are not included, but begin three years later. Faculty minutes go up to the move to Berrien Springs. Faculty minutes from the first two years in Berrien Springs are not extant.

The Seminary minutes date from the beginning of the Advanced Bible School through the vote to move from Washington. Potomac University minutes cover the crucial years from the decision to move until the school was in full operation in Berrien Springs.

The minutes come from different committees. Many are from the faculty meetings, but there are also Board of Trustees and other committees. For minutes not included here, contact the University Archivist at Archives@andrews.edu.

Arrangement

It is difficult to describe the arrangement since the ones who did it are no longer available at this writing, and the arrangement is not what would be done today. This is a collection that needs to be revised. The minutes are bound in binders numbered as "Volume." It is not clear to us how these were ordered. Possibly chronological, but that is not always the case.

There are additional minutes that follow the five boxes listed in this register. Most of these are the Emmanuel Missionary College. and Andrews University Board of Trustees. Note that the Board of Trustee minutes are closed for research use for 35 years after the meeting date.

Extent

5 boxes [2.0 linear feet] + 12 linear feet of additional minutes.

Provenance

The provenance is not known. They were likely in an administrator's office until the Heritage Room began in the mid to late 1960s. However they arrived, they are official records of Andrews University and fall under the management of the Andrews University Archives and Records Center. They are stored in the Center for Adventist Research in a cooperative arrangement with the University Archives.

Use

All users of this collection will be required to complete the "Application to Use Unpublished Record," and to observe the regulation specified in the "Patron's Agreement" and "Researcher's Code of Conduct."
