Roy Branson Collection (Collection 029)

Biography

Roy Branson (1937-2015) was born in Portland, Oregon, to Adventist missionaries and raised in Egypt and Lebanon. In his academic career, he earned his English undergraduate degree from Atlantic Union College and graduate degrees from the University of Chicago and Andrews University in English. In 1968, he earned a PhD in religious ethics from Harvard University.

From there, he went on to begin his teaching career at Andrews University as an associate professor in theology and ethics. It was also during this time in his early career, late 1960s and early 1970s, that Branson was a co-founder the Association of Adventist Forums. This later led to the independent Adventist magazine called *Spectrum*, published by the Forums. Another notable accomplishment in his professional career was his advocacy for social justice.

Scope

The Roy Branson Papers contains Roy's correspondence from 1967 to 1972 and other documents concerning the establishment of *Spectrum*. This dates largely from his time as an associate professor of ethics at Andrews University. For his work for social justice, there are 194 slides and 16 recording tapes from his inner city outreaches with African Americans from 1968-1969. Also in this collection is *Harambe*, Vol. 1 No. 1, and a children's perspective booklet of the Washington, D.C., riots of July 1968.

Arrangement

The arrangement is largely as Branson left it except for the chronological ordering of the correspondence and the collection of slides. Also within this set, it has been ordered topically. The main volume of this collection is Branson's correspondence covering portions of the beginnings of *Spectrum* and his inner city work.
