Gilbert-Tymeson Family Papers (Collection 368)

Biographies

Frederick Carnes (F. C.) Gilbert was born in 1867 in London, England. Born into a Jewish family, perhaps under the name Morris Cohen, Gilbert immigrated to the United States as a young man, and was one of the first Jewish converts to Seventh-day Adventism. Ella May Graham was born in 1865 in Mansfield, Connecticut. She was a member of the first graduating class of South Lancaster Academy in 1888. F. C. Gilbert graduated from South Lancaster Academy in 1896, and married Ella May Graham the same year. Together they had four children, Ruth (Miller), Miriam (Tymeson), William, and Louis.

F. C. Gilbert became a Seventh-day Adventist evangelist and author, and served as the secretary of the Jewish Department of the General Conference of Seventh-day Adventists from 1936 until his death in 1946. Ella May served as a teacher, and died in 1944.


Miriam (Gilbert) Tymeson was born in 1902 in South Lancaster, Massachusetts. Sydney Tymeson was born in 1899 in New York. Both attended South Lancaster Academy, and Lancaster Junior College. Miriam completed her studies in education at Washington Missionary College. After their marriage, Sydney and Miriam both taught at Greater New York Academy, where Sydney served as principal from 1929-1932. Sydney then took a call to teach in the Business Department of Washington Missionary College, later Columbia Union College (and now Washington Adventist University), where he would serve until his retirement, spending a great majority of his time as chair of that department. Miriam taught at the Takoma Park Church school, becoming its principal in 1935. In 1937 the Takoma Park school combined with other area churches to become the first "union school," a school with multiple constituent churches. Miriam was the first principal, and served in this capacity until 1978. Miriam died in 1984 while on vacation in New London, New Hampshire. Sydney died four years later, in 1988.

To help aid the researcher in understanding this family, a family tree from www.familysearch.org is pasted below. There is more information on this site. You may need to create a free account to view some of the details.

A few explanatory notes may be helpful.

- 1. I was not able to independently verify the names of F. C. Gilbert's parents, nor the theory that he was born "Morris Cohen."
- 2. Louis Gilbert, the youngest child of F. C. & Ella May Gilbert, was married at least three times. Wilma Johnson, who appears on the tree, was the only wife he had a child with, Patricia. The details are murky, but it appears that when Wilma left Louis, Ruth (Gilbert) Miller and her husband Edward adopted Patricia, the only grandchild F. C. & Ella May had.

3. Lavina (Thayer) Graham and Sarah Jane "Jennie" Thayer were sisters of Mary Ann (Thayer) Graham, Ella May (Graham) Gilbert's mother.



Scope

This collection contains personal documents from Miriam and Sydney Tymeson, which include many items from Miriam's parents, F. C. & Ella May Gilbert, as well as those from a few other family members. Items in this collection include personal papers, educational materials, articles and talks, and a substantial number of photographs.

Arrangement

This collection is divided into six parts. The first four sections contain items relating to F. C. Gilbert, Ella May (Graham) Gilbert, Sydney Tymeson, and Miriam (Gilbert) Tymeson respectively. Within these sections, items begin with biographical materials, and include educational materials, items related to career/work, articles and talks by the individual, articles about the individual, and awards and honors. The fifth section contains materials on other family members, and the sixth contains copies of the photographs found in this collection.
