The Harold B. Hannum Papers (Collection 048)

Biography

Harold B. Hannum (1901-1985) was born in Cleveland, Ohio, as one of five children to Byron F. and Agnes B. Cochrane Hannum. While very young, he studied piano at the nationally noted Oberlin College Conservatory of Music near Cleveland. Following completion of high school, he enrolled at Washington Missionary College (WMC), where he attended from 1919 to 1923 and completed an AB degree. He started his teaching career at Southwestern Junior College, now Southwestern Adventist University, in 1923. A year later, he returned to WMC, where he would teach for the next five years and complete a B. Mus. at the Peabody Conservatory of Music.

In 1929 Hannum accepted an invitation to teach in the music department at Emmanuel Missionary College, now Andrews University, eventually becoming chair of the department in 1934 while completing an M. Mus. at Northwestern University and became an Associate in the American Guild of Organists. While at EMC, Hannum became deeply involved in developing and producing a new hymnal for the Seventh-day Adventist Church, becoming known as its unofficial editor. The *Church Hymnal* was criticized by some upon its release in 1941 as being too "high church," and Hannum, too, also regarded it as flawed, as he later offered advice and encouragement in the planning stages for its replacement, the 1985 *Seventh-day Adventist Hymnal*.

Hannum accepted a position at La Sierra College, now La Sierra University, in 1944, where he would serve as organist and chair the music program for more than two decades. During his lifetime, he published three books on music and worship, entitled *Music and Worship* (1969), *The Christian Search for Beauty* (1975), and *Let the People Sing* (1981).

Hannum retired in 1978. He was residing in Riverside, California, at the time of his death on January 27, 1985, at age 83. He was survived by his wife, Ethyl; two daughters, Elizabeth Fisher and Maguerite Hossler; and four grandchildren.

Scope

The Harold B. Hannum Papers collection contains Hannum's correspondence from 1931 to 1969, most notably with L. E. Froom and I. H. Evans. A significant portion of this collection is dedicated to Hannum's work in editing and the overall production of the Seventh-day Adventist *Church Hymnal* published in 1941, and other related topics, his music studies, and denomination music. Besides Hannum's correspondence, the collection contains Volumes I and II of Hannum's, *The Hymnal*, as well as several music programs at Northwestern University, Washington Missionary College, and the Emmanuel Missionary College Church.

Arrangement

The material is kept in chronological and topical sequence, in much the same order as received. Much of the material comes from H. B. Hannum himself sent to Mrs. Louise Dederen at the Heritage Room of Andrews University.
