## Johnson-Lewis Family Letters (Collection 382)

#### **Scope and Content**

The Johnson-Lewis Family Letters collection contains the personal and some work-work-related correspondence and documents between members of the Charles C. Lewis family and their children and grandchildren from 1878 to early 2000. Members of the Lewis, Johnson, and Caviness families held responsible positions in various parts of the Seventh-day Adventist Church work. While many of the letters are personal in nature, there are a number of business-related letters that provide some picture of the work done by family members. Also included are some documents and publications authored by family members.

#### **Biography**

- Charles C Lewis (1857-1924) was an Adventist educator and president of several Adventist colleges including Southwestern, Union, and Walla Walla colleges. He served as president of the Fireside Correspondence School from 1920 to 1923.
- <u>Elizabeth Ann Wiley</u> (1857-1915) was an educator with a strong desire to advance Adventist education.

Charles and Elizabeth had four children namely,

- <u>Gertrude Ramona Lewis</u>. Died at the age of seven of an acute febrile contagious virus disease.
- Irma Edna Lewis. Married Ernest Roy Johnson in 1913. Irma was a teacher at San Fernando Academy, California. Ernest and Irma served the church for many years in the United States, Mexico, Cuba and the Panama Canal Zone. They both served the church as teachers, missionaries, pastors, editors and writers. In 1919 Ernest became the founding editor of *El Centinela*, the Spanish language *Signs of the Times*, a magazine he edited for seven years.
- Agnes Elvira Lewis, with her husband, Leon L. Caviness, served in several Adventist Colleges in the United States and overseas. Leon was the first principal of Seminaire Adventiste du Saleve at its current location. Agnes wrote many articles for *The Youth's Instructor* and the *Review and Herald*, and authored the book, *The Way He Should Go.* After 12 years of

overseas service, the family returned to Pacific Union College. There Agnes taught French and German, and pioneered teaching classes in marriage and the family. Leon joined the theology department and participated in the development of the Advanced Bible School, forerunner of the Seventh-day Adventist Theological Seminary, and the Bible Research Fellowship.

Charles Harold Lewis. No information.
