# Scope and Content

## Biographical

Julia Anne Burgess was born July 22, 1843, in Ohio. At the age of 12 she moved with her parents to Michigan where she remained until 1875. During this time in Michigan, she began teaching school at age 14 and continued teaching for 10 years. At that point, 1868, when she was 25, she married John Orr Corliss. From that point, she gave "her life to the work in which her husband was engaged."

Through these years, John and Julia had five children with three of them as children:

Fred, born Feb 4, 1873. Dies Oct 24, 1873. Louie, born ??. Died Aug 23, 1876. Lou, born Jan 18, 1875. Died as a child Lula, born Mar 21, 1877. Burr, born Jan 3, 1882.

This information taken from the diaries is somewhat incomplete. The dates given come from entries by Julia marking the anniversary of these events.

Julia died quite suddenly of pneumonia while at camp meeting in southern California on Aug 16, 1912.

#### Content

This diary is simply that, a diary where Julia recorded events and anniversaries in her life and that of her family. You can follow John's work through the various places they lived. Julia records a wide range of activities.

Someone typed a transcript of the 1863 to 1869 and 1883 to 1891 diary entries. This transcript, however, is "selected." A complete transcript is available for the 1863 to 1869 and the 1883 to 1891 diary entries. This complete transcript was transcribed by Juliette Johnson in 2017 and 2018.

The early years are a challenge to read, but the later years are easier. These problems are exacerbated by the fact that our copy of the diary is a photocopy.

#### Arrangement

Being a diary the arrangement is chronological. During processing divider sheets of paper were inserted. The year break was not always neat, so the divider is at the page where the division of years happens. See the register below for a clear understanding of the arrangement.

#### Provenance

In 1977-1978, the diaries were in possession of Mildred C. Martin, a granddaughter of Julia Corliss through her father, Burr Corliss. At that time she allowed Sam Croft to make this photocopy. Mildred then moved and the original diaries were lost as far as we know.

In 1996, Sam Croft allowed Merlin Burt of the Loma Linda University Heritage Room, to review the diaries. Croft eventually gave the diaries to Burt as a personal gift. In 2010, Burt placed the diaries in the Andrews University Center for Adventist Research. Croft planed to publish the diaries or do something else with them, but never did. From what we know, Croft has died so the Center feels free to make them available to the public.

#### Use

All users of this collection will complete the "Application to Use Unpublished Records," and observe the regulation specified in the "Patron's Agreement" and "Researcher's Code of Conduct." All records in this collection are open and available for research. There was a note that portions of the Chamberlain documents may not be fully open, but there was no notation as to which portions.
