Clara Nosworthy-Wright Papers (Collection 371)

Biography

Clara Jeanette Nosworthy-Wright (1904-1992) was born in Brooklyn, NY, and graduated from the newly renamed Lancaster Junior College in 1922, and graduated again from the yet again newly renamed Atlantic Union College in 1924 from the Normal Course for teachers. She married Kenneth A. Wright in 1924, and the two of them worked together as he served as principal of Adventist academies, President of Southern Missionary College (1956-1960), as a pastor, and a church administrator.

Clara Wright wrote articles and poems for Adventist publications, served as president of the Florida Health and Welfare area federation for 10 years, and held other local church offices. For nearly 15 years she wrote a column called, "Florida Living," for the Apopka, FL *Planter*. She received an award, at age 84, for "most extensive press coverage" from the Florida Conference of Seventh-day Adventists for her service as communications director for her local church.

Scope

This collection includes family materials, programs from graduations, letters to Atlantic Union College's alumni newsletters, and a few publications written by Wright.

Arrangement

This collection begins with items relating to Wright and her family. The remainder is roughly chronological, starting with her educational achievements, then moving to her volunteer work with AUC's alumni, and finally, the publications she wrote and had in her collection.
