# George B. Replogle Papers (Collection 387)

## Biography

George Brumbaugh Replogle (1866-1955) was a physician and medical missionary for the Seventh-day Adventist Church in South Africa and Argentina. He was born on October 13, 1866, in McVeytown, Mifflin County, Pennsylvania. He was the fifth child of Samuel Brumbaugh Replogle and Margaret Ann Hanawalt Replogle.

George worked as a telegraph operator for the Pennsylvania and Santa Fe railroads, and later as a school teacher. In 1887 at the age of 21, George joined the Seventh-day Adventist Church. He did literature evangelism in his home state of Pennsylvania for some time before enrolling for nursing training at Battle Creek Sanitarium, from which he graduated in 1892. In 1893, he managed the Chicago branch of the sanitarium during the World's Fair.

On May 31, 1893, George married Anna Stone, a nurse like him, at Battle Creek, Calhoun County, Michigan. The couple went to Cape Town, South Africa, to begin Seventh-day Adventist medical work in Africa. They had three children: Joseph Dallas Replogle (1894-1979), Leon Replogle (1902-1998), and George Hanawalt Brumbaugh Replogle Jr. (1908-1967).

In 1902, George lived in London, England, where he worked (or studied) as a physician at Oxford University. In 1909 or 1910, he joined the staff of the River Plate Sanitarium and served as a physician and business manager of that institution until he returned to the United States in 1944.

While the family was serving as missionaries in Argentina, Anna passed away and was buried in a cemetery at Reo Ceballos, Argentina. George then returned to the United States, where he married Anna's sister, Laura Stone (1876-1954), in 1944.

George B. Replogle died on July 23, 1955, at the age of 88, in Kimmell, Noble County, Indiana, USA.

## Scope

The George B. Replogle Collection is a compilation of diaries authored by George B. Replogle during the period from 1911 to 1940, alongside various other documents that pertain to his personal finances and family affairs. The collection is enriched with photographs of Replogle himself, as well as his family members. The collection includes documents that relate to Clark P. Kleine and Gladys Shirk, who we believed to be Clark's wife. The nature of the relationship between George B. Replogle and Clark P. Kleine is unclear.

## **Arrangement**

The collection is organized into five series or sections, with the initial four specifically dedicated to George B. Replogle and his family. Section one consists of George B. Replogle's diaries in chronological order, while section two comprises finance-related archives. Section three encompasses a compilation of photos of George B. Replogle and his family, featuring identified and unidentified individuals, in addition to a diverse range of locations and landscapes. Section four incorporates documents concerning George B. Replogle and his family. The fifth section pertains to Clark P. Kleine and his wife, Gladys Shirk.
