# Dan Shultz Papers (Collection 364)

#### **Biography**

An oboist and conductor, Dan Shultz taught in and served as chair of music departments at two academies and two colleges in the Seventh-day Adventist educational system. He served as chair of the music department and professor of music at Walla Walla College for 21 years and retired in 2000 after forty years of teaching. He wrote extensively on the history of music in the Adventist church.

Dan was born in Bradford, Pennsylvania, on April 8, 1938, the oldest of five children of Courtney Lyle and Alice Frances Scott Shultz. Although neither parent was a musician, they were musical and eager to give their children opportunities for music study. All of the children learned to play instruments and participated in school music groups.

Dan's sister, Barbara, a pianist also played cello, and was active as an amateur musician throughout her life. Both she and another sister, Dee, who had also taken piano lessons and then viola in high school, played in the high school orchestra where Dan played oboe. Two younger brothers, Lawrence and Louis, played tuba in bands that Dan conducted in the 1960s.

Following graduation from high school in 1956, Dan enrolled as a music major at Washington Missionary College, now Washington Adventist University, where he pursued a degree in oboe performance. He transferred to Atlantic Union College (AUC) at the end of his first year, where he completed a B.S. in music education with oboe as his performance area.

While at AUC, Dan met and married JoAn Teresa Bell, a nursing student, later an art major, in 1958. They had four children, Denise Lynn (Hickerson), Karan Lea (Rau, Case), Rhonda Leah (Rieseberg, Moravec), and Jeffry Lyle.

During his senior year at AUC Dan was band director at Hillside School for Boys, a private school run by the Daughters of the American Revolution in Massachusetts. At the end of that year, he accepted a position in 1961 at Forest Lake Academy in Florida, where he served as band director and chair of the music department for three years.

In 1964 they moved to Adelphian Academy in Michigan, where Dan directed the band and, in his second year, also assumed leadership of the music department. Membership of the band during his four years there increased to over 90 members. While at AA, Dan completed an M.Mus. at Andrews University in 1967.

Dan was offered a position at Union College in 1968, where for the next eleven years he directed the band, taught, and, in his final three years, also served as chair of

the Fine Arts Department. The band program expanded during that time to two bands involving nearly 100 members. From 1975 to 1977 the band took three bicentennial tours that included traveling over 15,000 miles and giving 34 concerts in thirty states.

In 1979 Shultz accepted an invitation to serve as chair of the music department at Walla Walla College (WWC), now University, where he also directed the bands until 1983. Following a divorce in 1983, Dan married Carolyn G. Stevens, an English professor, in 1984.

Until his retirement in 2000, Dan continued to lead the department and taught conducting, music education, and woodwinds and was the primary teacher for the Introduction to Music and World Music classes, an area of great interest to him. Over 2,700 WWC students took these elective class. Following retirement, Dan continued to teach Introduction to Music, and World Music, a class he had started in 1999, and oboe lessons until 2012.

Shultz was primarily responsible for the founding of the International Adventist Musicians Association in 1984 and served as both its president and editor of its publications until 1992, when Elsie Buck accepted an invitation to serve as president and Dan continued as publications editor, a position he held until 2019. He was also a member of the Walla Walla Symphony board of directors for several years and its president from 1985 to 1988.

Dan was a consultant for two editions of the primary textbook used nationally in secondary music methods classes and for two music appreciation textbooks. He also composed two band works which were listed as official bicentennial activities and authored a book on the history of music at WWC, *A Great Tradition*, released during the school's centennial in 1992.

He completed a centennial history of the Walla Walla Symphony, *A Dream Fulfilled*, in July 2006, and completed *Adventist Musicians Biographical Resource* in 2014, a reference work with biographies for over 1,000 Seventh-day Adventist musicians.

While at Union College, Dan received an award for creative teaching in 1973 and was recognized as an Outstanding Educator in America in 1974. He received the Zapara Excellence in Teaching Award at WWC in 1996 and was honored with an endowed music scholarship in his name at the time of his retirement, funded through donations from former students, colleagues, family, and friends.

The overall arrangement was done by the Center of Adventist Research. We did keep the original chronological arrangement of the biographical information done by Dan Shultz himself. No effort was made to sort the materials by writer/recipient or by date.
