Biography

Milton Charles "M. C." Wilcox (1853-1935) served as an editor and author of several Seventh-day Adventist books and periodicals. After training as an assistant under Uriah Smith at the *Review and Herald*, Wilcox started the *Present Truth* (Great Britain) in 1884. In 1889 he began a 45 year career at the Pacific Press Publishing Association. At times he was responsible for several periodicals simultaneously. His longest association was as the editor of the *Signs of the Times*, a post he held until his retirement in 1933. In addition to his editorial work, he was active as a pastor and a board member of several entities within the Adventist denomination.

Wilcox married Kate Althea Osterhout in 1882. In 1883, they had their first child, Kathrina Blossom. Kate worked as an editor of the "Women's Realm" column in the *Pacific Health Journal*, a contributor to several other periodicals, and was a speaker at conventions and camp meetings. Milton C. Wilcox died in 1935 and Kate died in 1938.

Scope

The Milton C. Wilcox Family Papers collection contains letters and postcards sent between family members and friends of the family from 1887 to 1897. This was the time the family moved to California with Milton taking a position at Pacific Press.

Arrangement

The collection is arranged chronologically on the basis of the addressee. Envelopes are kept with their corresponding letters.
